Kansas employers are invited to register for the second annual Give Back Kansas Challenge and encourage their employees to participate in community volunteering.

There is no cost to participate, and the Challenge is open to any employer in Kansas (for profit, nonprofit, and government). Employers register in advance to participate, and volunteer hours are reported through an online portal by the employers' selfdesignated point of contact.

Based on the number of entries received and company size, employers will be divided into three categories (large, medium and small). Winners of the challenge will be selected by determining the average number of volunteer hours per employer completed during the challenge period. Employers achieving the highest average in each size category will have a \$1,000 donation made on their behalf by Volunteer Kansas to the charity of their choice. Those employers will be invited to a check presentation ceremony.
